

How to Use YourGOV

▶ Add a location

Type in an address, press and hold on the map, or use the current location tool to enter an issue location. Push the plus sign to add the issue.

▶ Select an issue

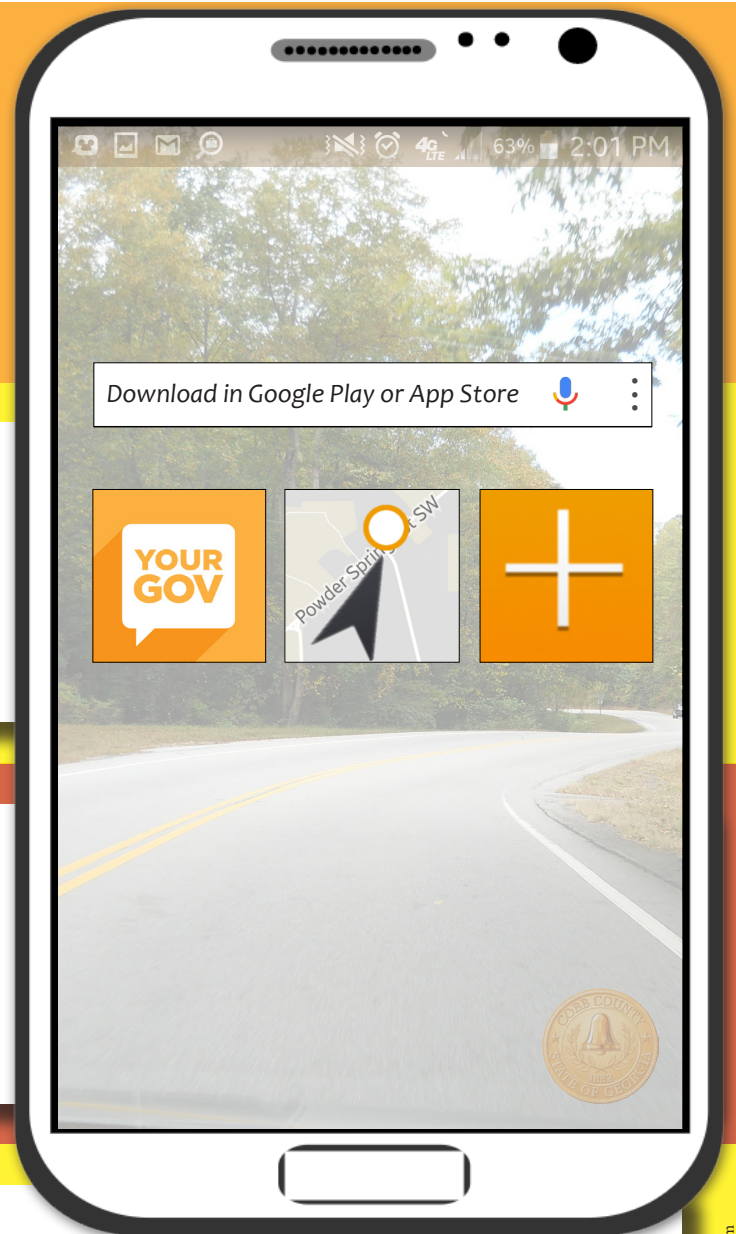
Choose the issue type from the dropdown menu. There are more than 20 possibilities. Choose the most accurate description.

▶ Submit a picture

Tap the camera image to add a photo from your device's camera roll or gallery. Be sure that the picture clearly shows the issue. After you make your selection, it will appear under the map on the issue reporting screen. Only take photos on or near a roadway when it is safe for you to do so.

▶ Include details

Provide more information about the issue so that crews can locate it easily and fix it quickly. The more details to clarify where the issue is, such as a landmark, the better! After you have completed this section, tap "Submit Request" to log your report in the work order system.

NICKAJACK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Traffic Pattern Change

The Cobb County Department of Transportation and Cobb County School District are committed to the safe and efficient movement of traffic and pedestrians within Cobb County School zones. To improve traffic safety and operation at Nickajack Elementary School, both agencies have cooperated to create additional on-site queuing for student drop-offs and pick-ups.

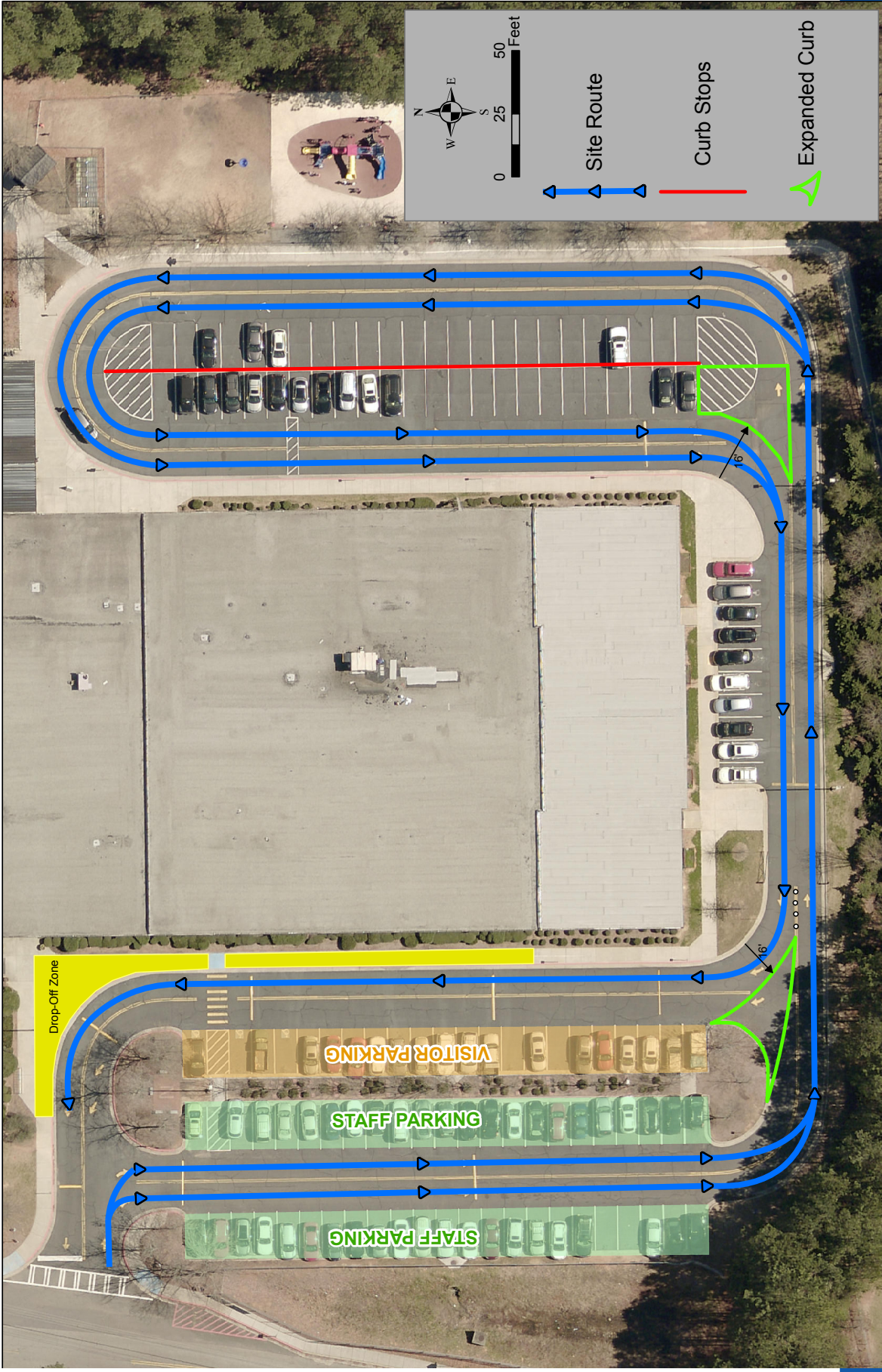
Beginning August 1, 2019, with the return of students from summer break, the drop-off/pick-up area will be relocated to the front of the school. The existing double-stacking area at the back of the school will be expanded, and a second double-stacking area will be added at the front of the school. Additional curbing will reinforce the new traffic pattern. Motorists will alternate turns merging at the double-stacking endpoints. These changes will alleviate current traffic backups onto Mavell Road and Cooper Lake Road. New signs, pavement markings, and other traffic control devices will be placed to guide motorists.
